

## 2012-1013 7A POWER RATING

### 7A Seeding Process

7A schools will use the following criteria for seeding football, volleyball, basketball, baseball, softball and soccer for 7A state play-off/tournament competition.

#### SEEDING

1. At the end of the season the 6A/7A schools will be ranked by conference standings. The AAA Tie Breaker rules will be used to rank any ties that may occur.
2. The 6A members of the conferences will be dropped out of the ranking and the standings will be renumbered.
3. The power rating will be applied.
4. The 7A South conference member Bryant will be inserted into the 7A West rankings according to the power ratings. The four 7A Central conference members and the four 7A East conference members will be inserted together in the rankings according to the power ratings.
5. The top six teams will qualify to the state tournament according to their seed/ranking. If there is a tie in power rankings, the first consideration would be head to head, the second will be a coin flip by the Executive Director of the AAA or his designee.

#### POWER RANKING (use conference games only)

1. 10 points per conference win
2. 1 point for each conference win of opponents you beat. (You must win the game before you can count opponent's points.)
3. 10 points per forfeit.
4. 1 point for a win against a 7A conference school during conference play.
5. 10 points for conference championship. In case of a tie for conference championship, the higher seed gets the 10-point bonus.

The total points will be added up in the win column, opponents win column, points for wins against 7A conference games, conference champs. Those numbers will be ranked from the highest to lowest for a power ranking.

The current 7A (team) bracket will be used for the state play-off/tournament.

It will be the responsibility of the 7A principals to select a person or persons to monitor and certify representatives to the state play-offs in all sports.

If a coin toss is used, an AAA director will administer.

1. GOLF – All teams in all schools would play 18 holes on one day. The top half of all teams (including ties), plus the next top eight individual scores (including ties), would play 18 holes the second day. Both day scores would be combined to determine the championship and medalist. If there are an uneven number of teams who play on the first day (for example 13), then the number of teams that advance would be rounded up, in this case seven teams would advance.
2. CROSS COUNTRY – Take all teams and individuals (as is)
3. DANCE – Take all teams (as is)
4. CHEER – Take all teams (as is)
5. SWIMMING – (as is)
6. WRESTLING – (as is)

7. BOWLING – (as is)
8. TENNIS – All teams in all schools will play in a conference tournament and will be seeded by the conference coaches (as currently done). The top six double teams plus the top 6 single teams would advance to the state tournament.
